
Shaye Byers and Mandy Chriswell loved talking in English.

Teachers and staff did a great job of trying to keep everyone entertained and made sure everything went smoothly. It was a difficult task since many activities were taking place simultaneously.


This day was a reward. A fun day in the sun. Hopefully, the idea of a Field Day as a reward will become a tradition and only improve with time.




CLASS OF 2004




Erin commented, "This was the best part I've ever had. It was nothing like any other character I've ever played."


Individually, the team was lead by freshman Cathrine Brunoehler, who advanced


