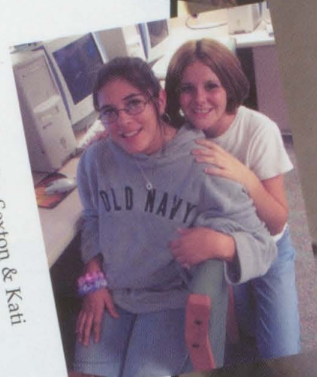
Shaye Byers and Mandy Chriswell loved talking in English.

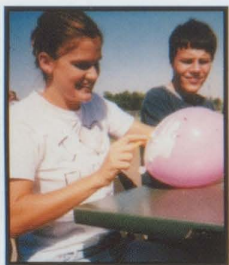


Field Day 2003

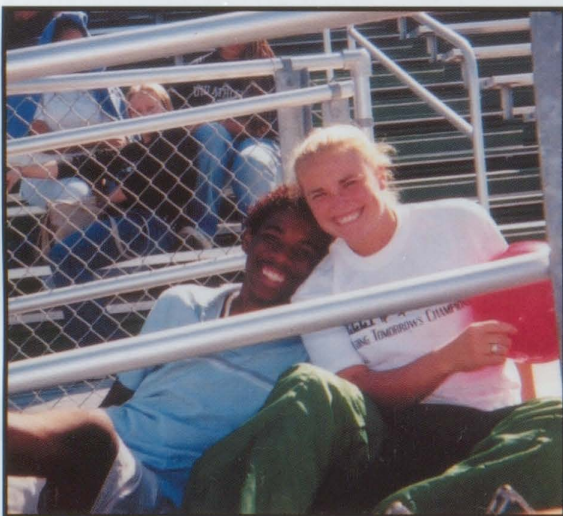

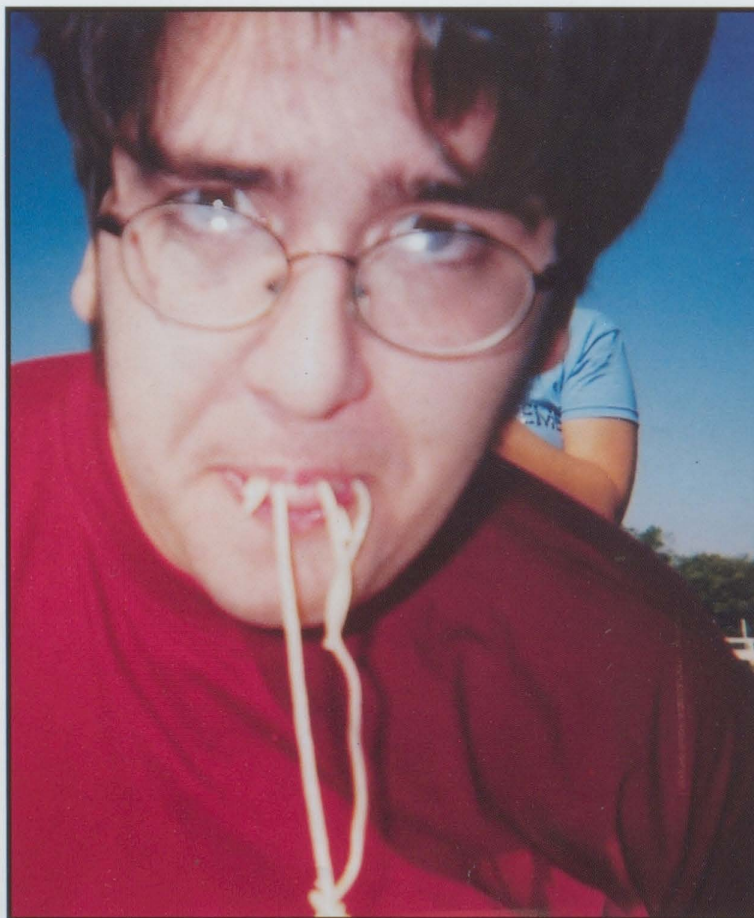
Teachers and staff did a great job of trying to keep everyone entertained and made sure everything went smoothly. It was a difficult task since many activities were taking place simultaneously.

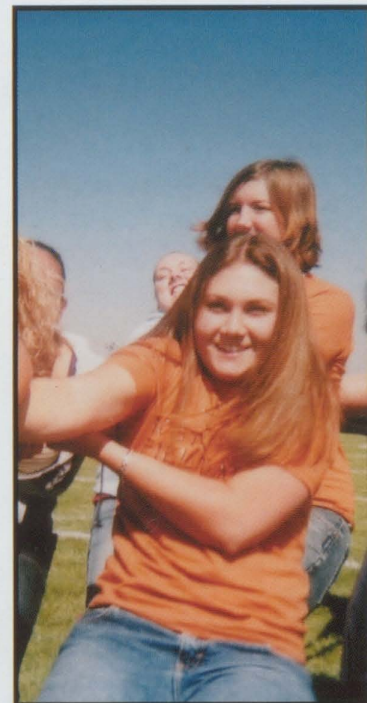

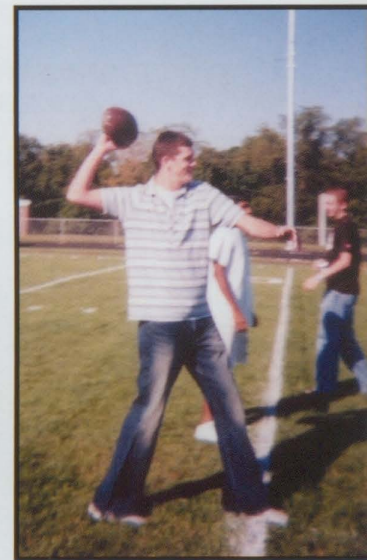
Senior Jake Brunoehler celebrated a sure victory by running down the football field during the game of Ultimate Frisbee and Senior Keshia Polston followed.

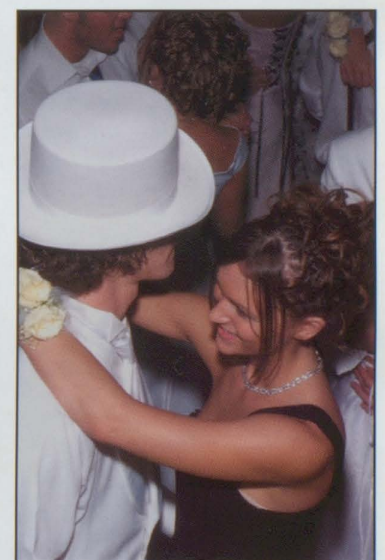

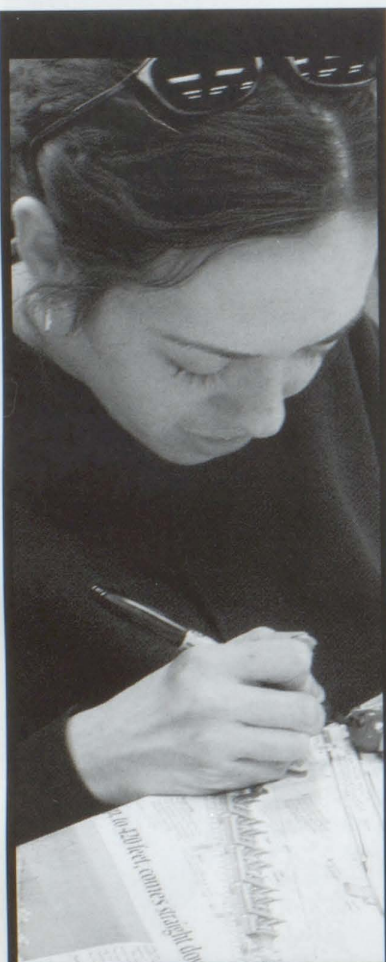
Creativity At its Best

Individually, the team was lead by freshman Cathrine Brunoehler, who advanced

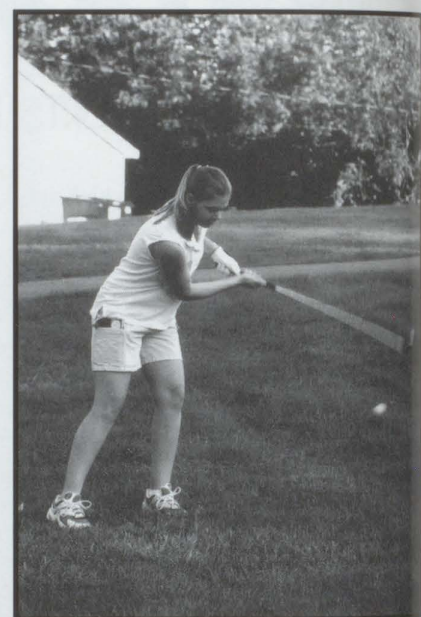

The junior class rounded out the skill of the senior class with size and power. Courtney Hoy,

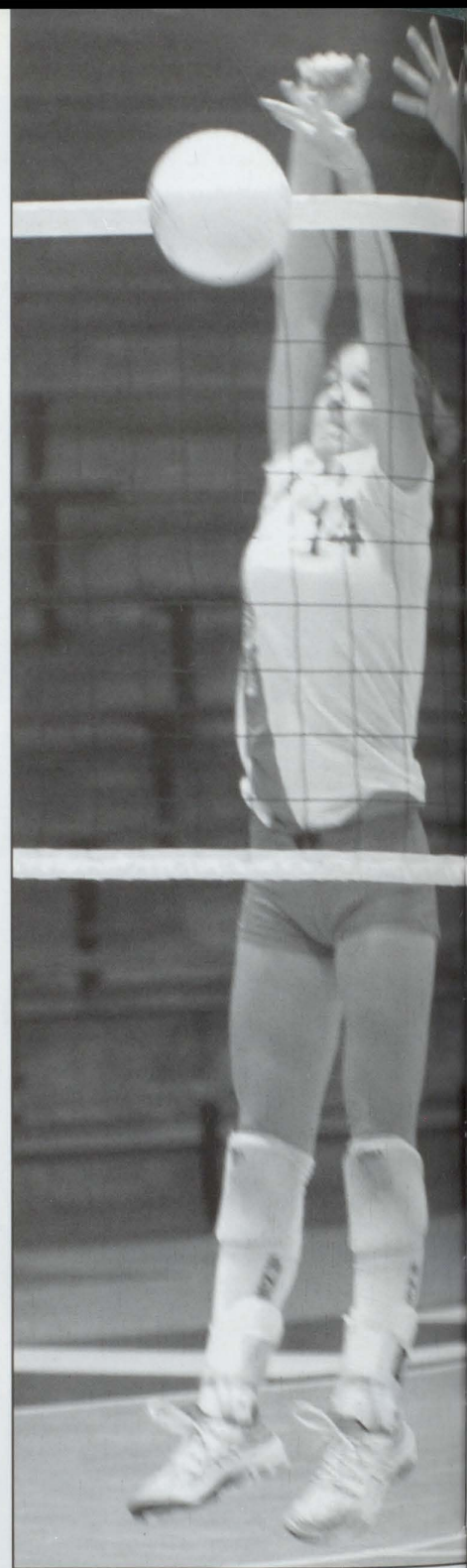

Malone being the lead scorer for the team. All three of these girls contributed awesome skills, wonderful personalities, and team spirit to everyone. Thanks for the great year ladies.

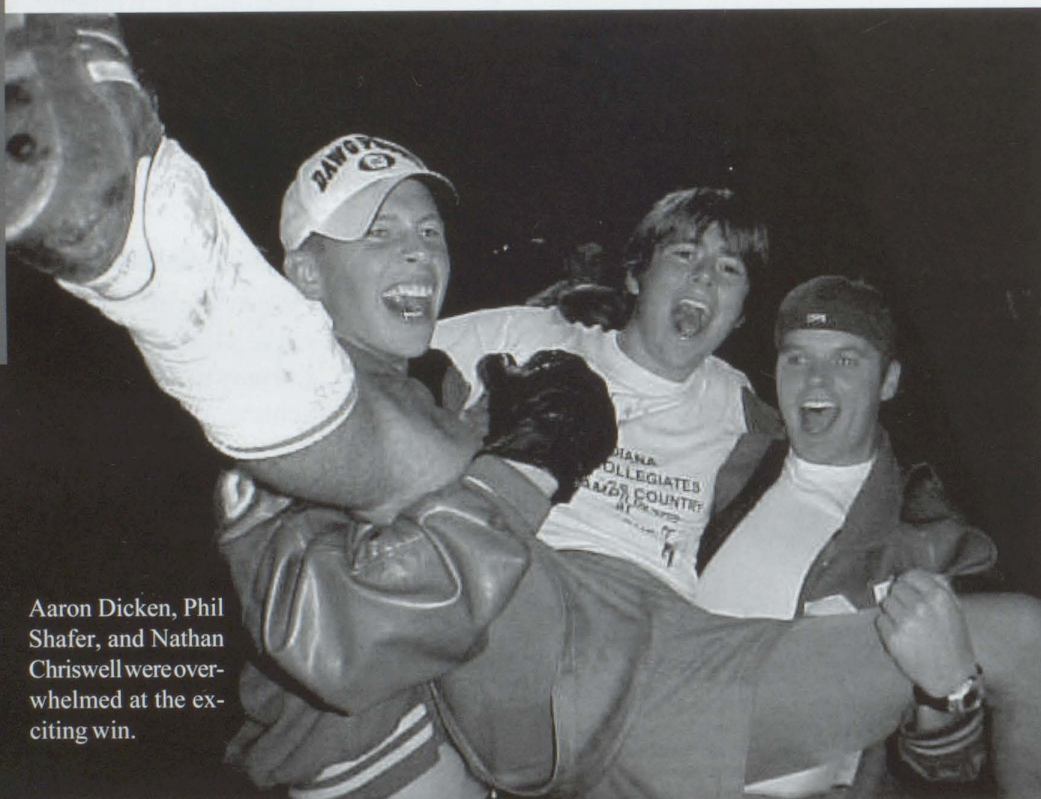

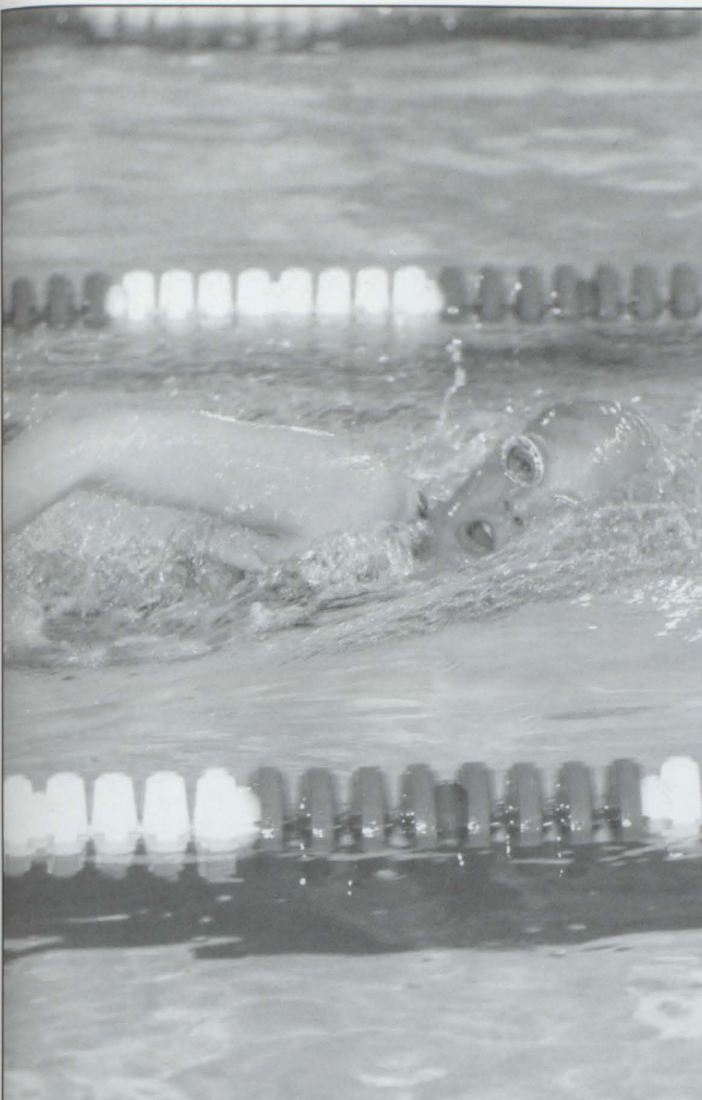

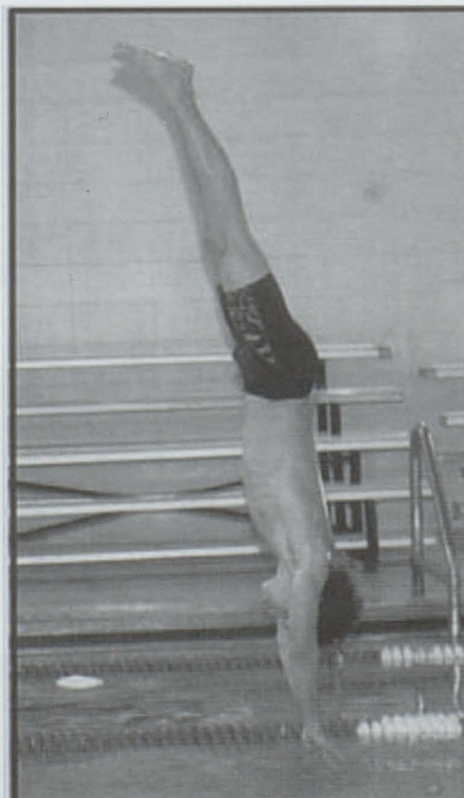

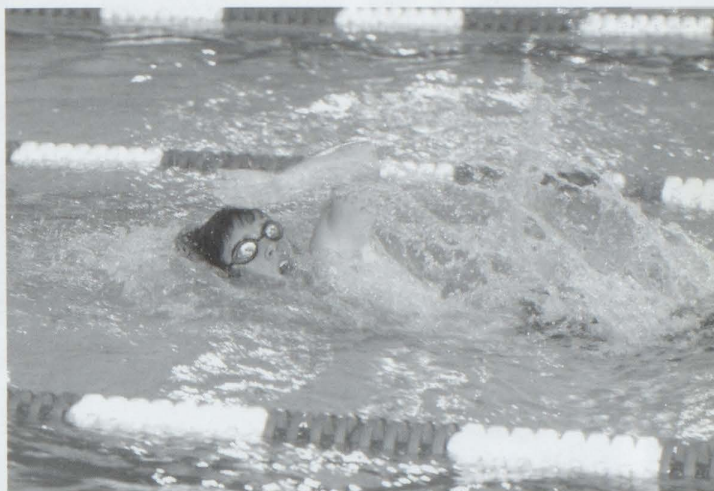

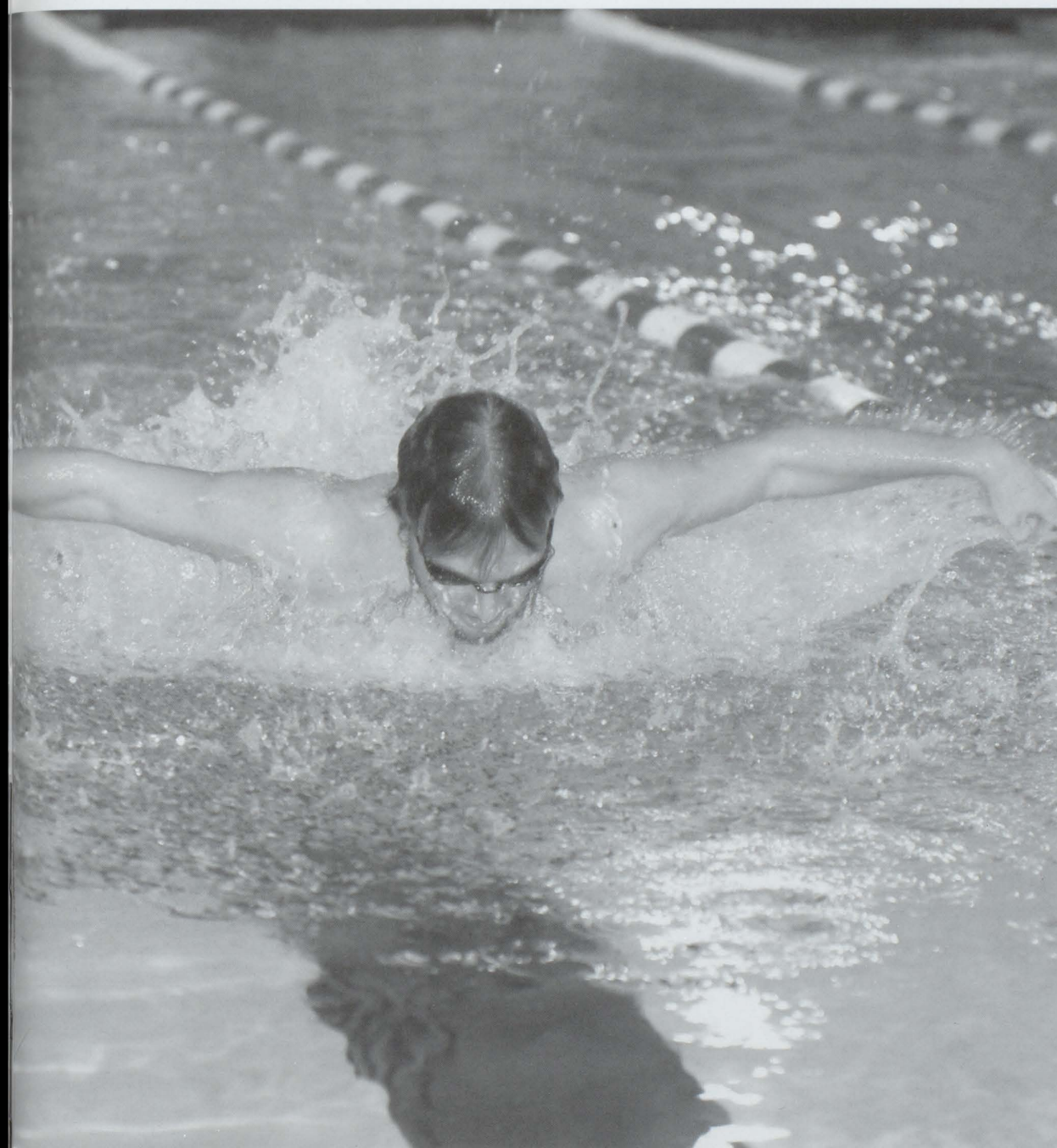

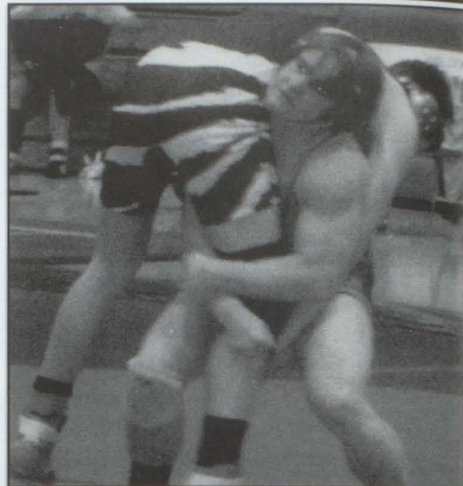

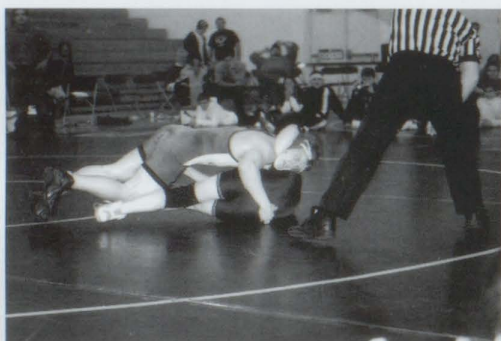

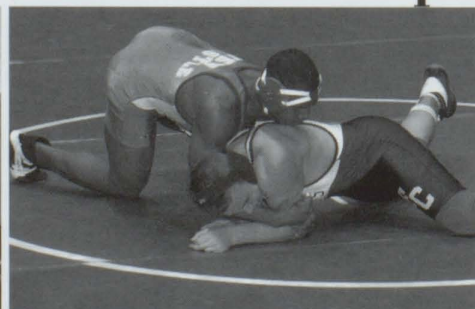

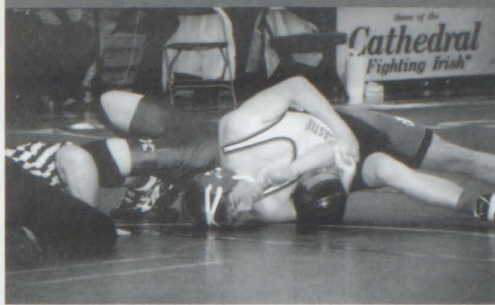

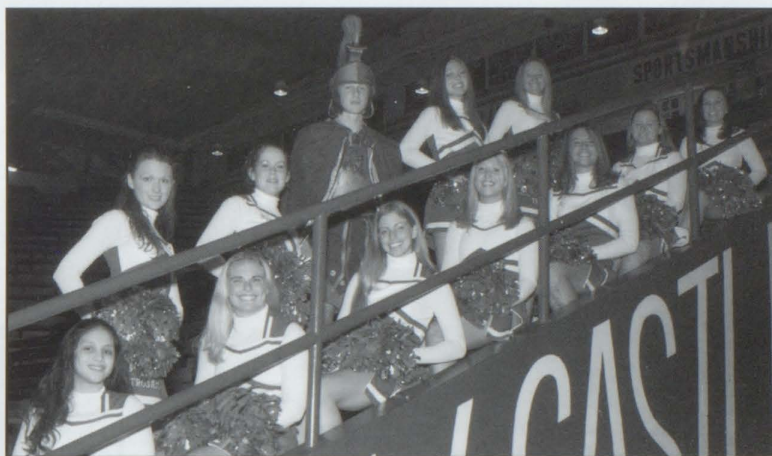

The NCCHS boys' basketball team had an awesome year with a record of 14-8. The Trojans definitely stomped their 2003-2004 rivals.

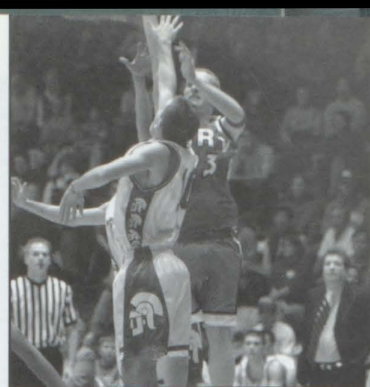

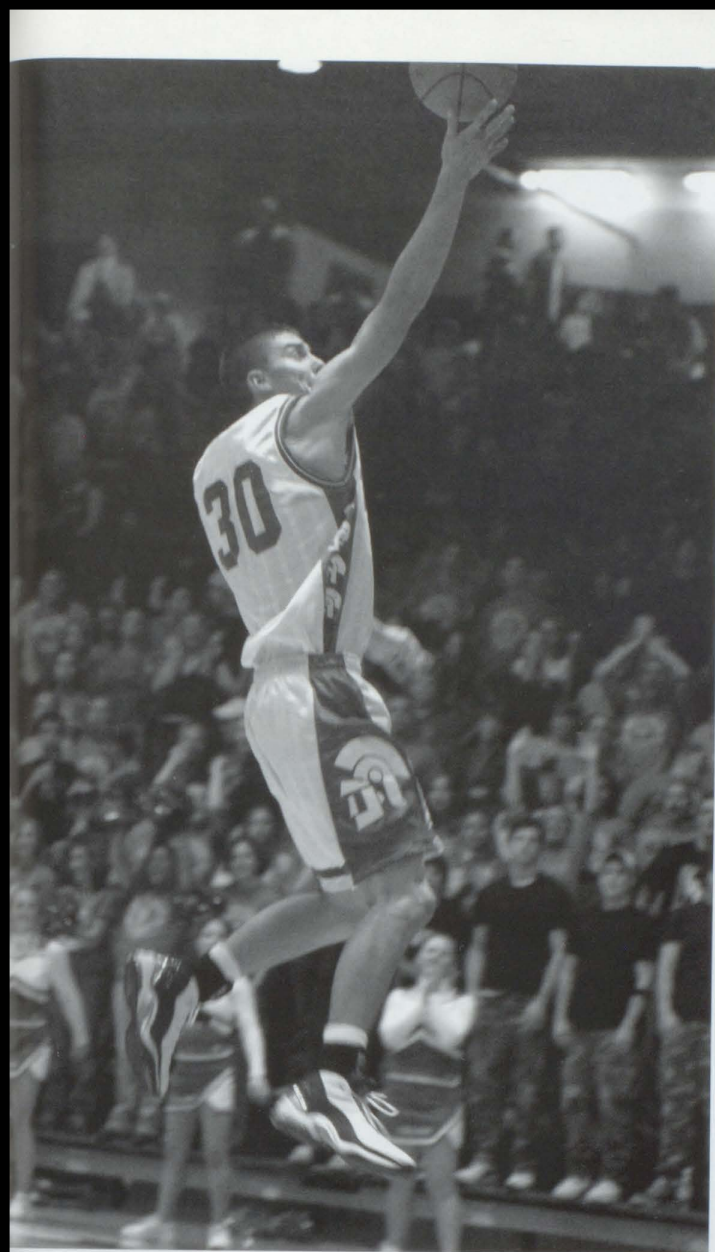

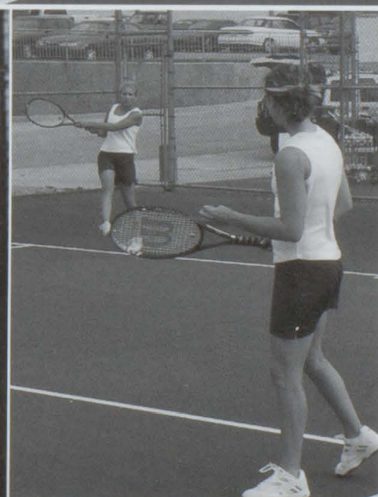

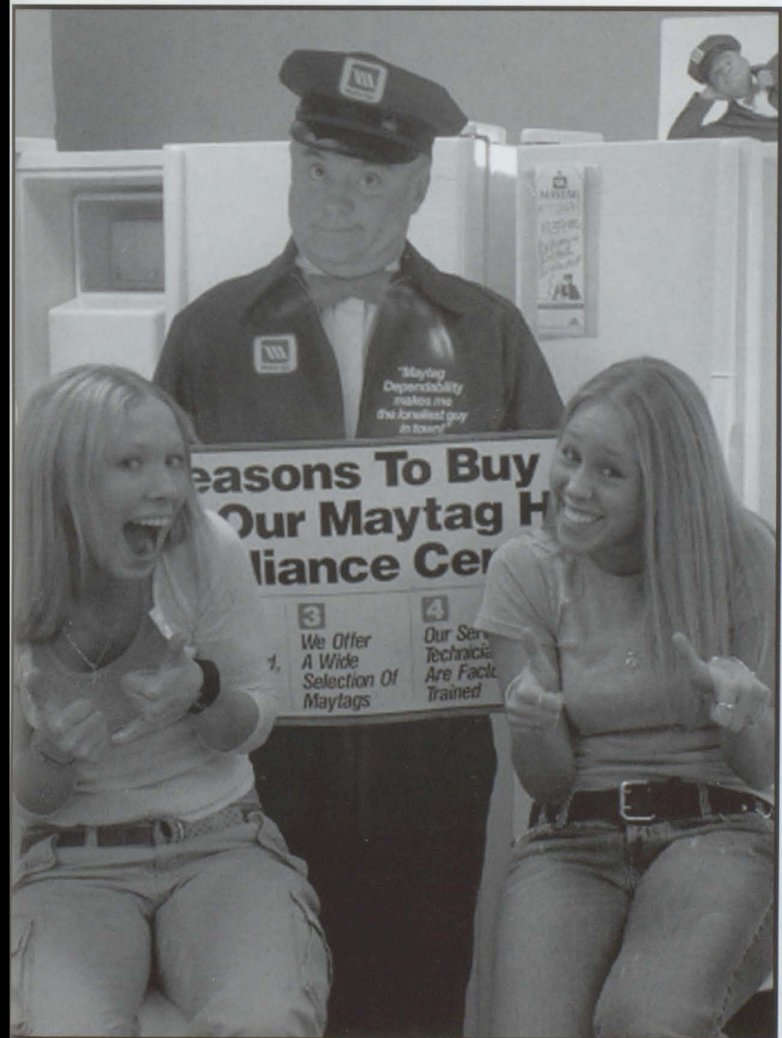
