Achievement Day is a day for honoring the outstanding scholars of New Castle Chrysler High School. Since the fall of 1961, 488 green blazers have been awarded to seniors who have maintained a grade point average of 11.0 or higher for six semesters.

New Castle Chrysler High School Principal Bruce Gaylor stated, "Achievement Day is probably one of the two best things that we do in this school. One is Achievement Day in the fall, and the other is the Rennissance Rally in the spring. Achievement Day recognizes students who have done what we've asked them to do."

This year, eight green blazers and 15 crests and certificates were awarded to the senior class. Senior Chris Upchurch mentioned, "The Achievement Day Convocation was great because it truly showed the respect that many students have for each other and that the student's efforts payed off." Also, 36 certificates were awarded to the junior class. "Several outstanding students have been recognized over the years during the Achievement Day Convocation. This year's group has to be one of the most diverse ever," said English Teacher and Achievement Day Coordinator Jim Robbins.
